Our prayer is that the New Year brings us all closer to Jesus.










Calling all women!

January 2024 Health and Wellness Moment "It's Blood Pressure Time!"

Happy New Year to you all! I pray all of you had a wonderful Christmas and that your next year, the year 2024, will hold many blessings and adventures for you and your loved ones!

We have a little announcement...some of us nurses here at the Barnum Community Church are going to be doing blood pressure screenings once again! Yay! We will be doing these screenings the second Sunday of every month, which should be easy for us all to remember, as this is also Communion Sunday each month. Blood pressures will be checked in the privacy of one of our back rooms, and will begin shortly after church service on these days. We are still figuring out details, so please be patient with us as we plan and prepare. We look forward to being able to provide this service to our congregation once again!

Because we are focusing on blood pressure, here is a quick and easy way to remember what the top and bottom numbers of your blood pressure (BP) mean, along with a quick summary of the BP categories.

Your blood pressure is recorded as two numbers, the systolic blood pressure (top number) and diastolic blood pressure (bottom number).

The systolic blood pressure indicates how much pressure your blood is exerting against your artery walls when your heart contracts.

The diastolic blood pressure indicates how much pressure your blood is exerting against your artery walls while your heart muscle is resting between contractions.

Both numbers are important and can be used in diagnosing high blood pressure.

Your BP can be put into one of 5 categories, which are recognized by the American Heart Association. These categories are:

- 1. Normal BP. BP numbers of less than 120/80 mm Hg (millimeters of mercury) are considered within the normal range. If your results fall into this category, stick with heart-healthy habits like following a balanced diet and getting regular exercise.
- 2. Elevated BP. This is when readings consistently range from 120-129 systolic and less than 80 diastolic. People with elevated BP are likely to develop high BP unless steps are taken to control the condition.
- 3. Hypertension Stage 1. This is when BP consistently ranges from 130-139 systolic or 80-89 diastolic. At this stage of high BP, health care professionals are likely to prescribe lifestyle changes and may consider adding BP medication based on your risk of atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease, or ASCVD, such as a heart attack or stroke.
- 4. Hypertension Stage 2. This is when BP consistently is 140/90 or higher. At this stage of high BP, health care professionals are likely to prescribe a combination of BP medications and lifestyle changes.
- 5. Hypertensive Crisis. This stage of high BP requires medical attention. If your BP readings suddenly exceed 180/120, wait 5 minutes and then test your BP again. If your readings are still unusually high, contact your healthcare professional immediately. This means going into the ER or Urgent Care or clinic right away. You could be experiencing a hypertensive crisis. If your BP is higher than 180/120 or you are experiencing signs of possible organ damage such as chest pain, shortness of breath, back pain, numbness/weakness, change in your vision or difficulty speaking, do not wait to see if your BP comes down on its own. Call 911 right away.

We have not focused on low BP in this article, but some people can have a BP that is too low. They can experience symptoms of dizziness and lightheadedness, confusion, fogginess, lack of concentration and vision changes (sparkles in the vision), to name a few. If you have any of these signs of a low BP, please be seen immediately as well. And as always, discuss your personal health condition with your healthcare provider, to know what is best for YOU. We are all unique!

We look forward to checking your BP's in 2024!




