We Do Have a King

Generally speaking, Americans don't like kings. In fact our dislike of kings became a primary reason this country came into existence, so somewhere in our DNA is an aversion to kings. For many, when they hear "king", one or two images come to mind. The first is of a distant tyrant across the ocean who mistreats people and taxes their tea. The second image is that of a now-meaningless figurehead, a historical office held over from the past that no longer wields any real power.

But when we speak of Jesus Christ as our King, we are not alluding to either tyrant or a figurehead, or even a benevolent king who rules for a season. We are instead speaking of a perfect, righteous, and loving King, one absolutely sovereign in His authority and eternal in His reign.

In both the Old and New Testaments we find explicit reference to Jesus the Messiah as being king. The angel Gabriel, when he announced to Mary that she would give birth to Jesus, said in Luke 1:32,33 that He would be of the lineage of King David, appointed to the throne of God the Father to reign over an eternal Kingdom. Elsewhere, Jesus is referred to as "King of the Jews" (Matthew 1:2), the "King of Israel" (Mark 15:32), the "blessed and only Sovereign" (1 Timothy 6:15) and "King of Kings and Lord of Lords" (Revelation 19:16). Even the term Lord, used so often of Jesus, speaks of supreme power and authority.

Ephesians 1:20-22 tells us that Jesus is now seated at the Father's right hand in heavenly places, "far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come."

Friends, we have a King, and His name is Jesus. And He is not just A king but The king, the King of Kings, with authority and dominion over all things. Our Lenten journey and Easter Sunday celebration this year will be focused on King Jesus. Join us in the journey through March.

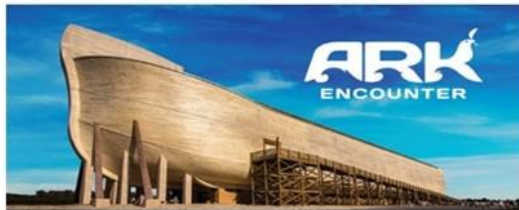

March 2024 Health and Wellness Moment

“Myeloma Awareness”

I pray everyone is doing well and enjoying the spring-like weather we've been having! There are so many Health Awareness topics for the month of March, and it was hard to decide which to focus this month's newsletter on. I have chosen one especially close to my heart as an Oncology Certified RN - March is Myeloma Awareness Month.

It is common for people to hear of the condition multiple myeloma and confuse it with melanoma. The truth is, they do sound incredibly similar. However, these two types of cancer are really quite different from one another. Melanoma is a type of skin cancer, while multiple myeloma is a cancer of the bone marrow and plasma cells of the blood (plasma cells are a type of white blood cell that produces antibodies). Multiple myeloma is the second most common blood cancer in the world, and the most prevalent among people of African descent. Multiple myeloma is also commonly referred to as plasma cell myeloma or just myeloma. Many cancers are linked to risk factors in our day to day lives, but multiple myeloma does not seem to be linked to avoidable lifestyle factors, so there is no known way to prevent multiple myelomas from developing. Multiple myeloma is not considered a hereditary disease, but there seem to be some genetic factors that make some people more susceptible to getting this condition. Although it seems to be a rare disease, men are more commonly diagnosed with multiple myeloma than women, and it is most frequently diagnosed in people between 65-74 years of age.

Cancer starts when cells begin to grow out of control. Cells in almost any part of the body can become cancer, and this cancer can spread to other areas of the body. Multiple myeloma is a cancer of plasma cells. Normal plasma cells are found in the bone marrow and are an important part of the immune system. When plasma cells in the bone marrow grow out of control, such as in multiple myeloma, these unhealthy cells can crowd out the normal blood-forming cells that are also in the bone marrow. Some health issues related to multiple myeloma can be:

- ~anemia – low red blood cells, which can cause fatigue and weakness
- ~thrombocytopenia – low platelets, which can cause increased bleeding and/or bruising
- ~leukopenia – low white blood cells, which can cause problems with fighting infections
- ~weak and brittle bones, elevated calcium in the blood
- ~kidney problems

Catching cancer early often allows for more treatment options. If you have any questions or concerns regarding multiple myeloma or the symptoms above, please contact your healthcare provider right away! And please remember, we are all uniquely made by our loving God, each of us is special and one-of-a-kind! What holds true for one of us can be quite different for someone else. Please just talk to your doctor with any health concerns or questions at all. They want to be there for you!

May the Lord bless you all during this Season of Lent, and may He guide and protect us all as we look forward to celebrating His loving death and glorious resurrection this Easter!

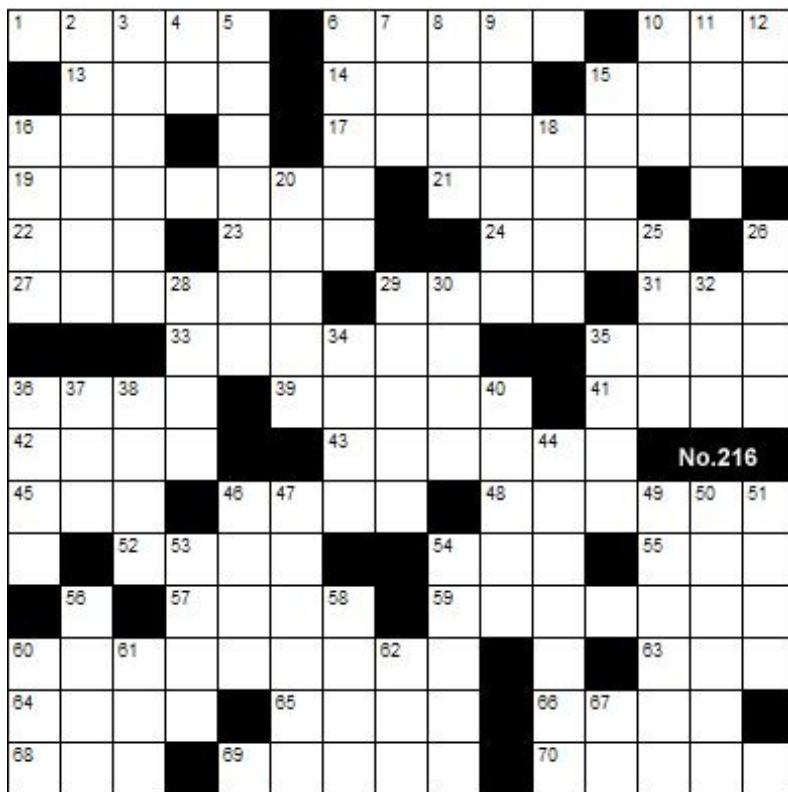

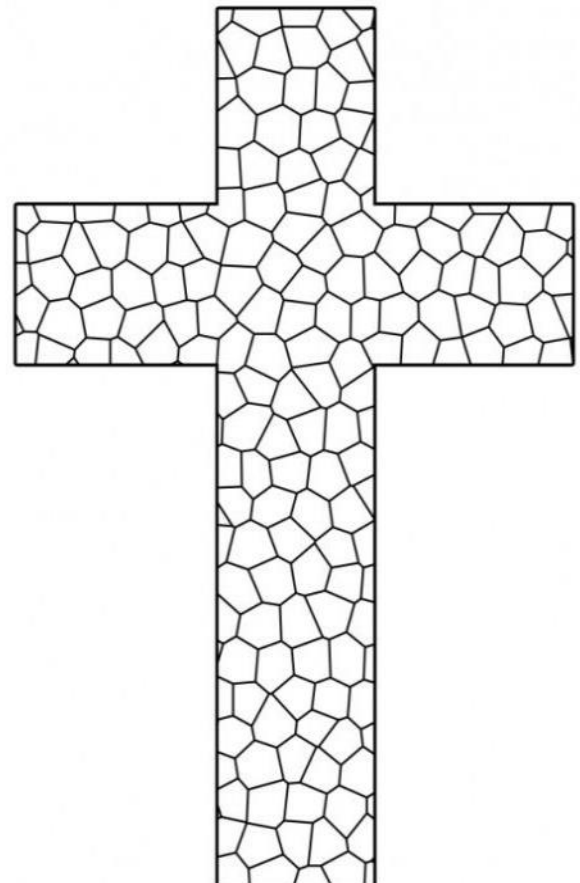

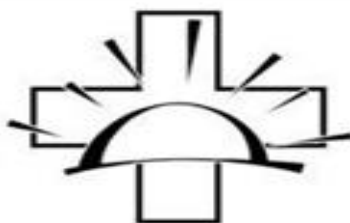
