

The Bible Buddies group had an exciting year in 2023-24. Our theme was that as followers of Jesus, we need to be "fishers of men," as directed by Matthew 4:19.

As part of our studies, we looked into parts of both the New and Old Testaments. We learned about various parables Jesus taught, including the Good Samaritan, the Prodigal Son, the Rich Man and Lazarus, the Good Shepherd, the Two Debtors, and the Ten Maidens. In understanding the meaning of these parables, some of the children were involved in skits in which they acted out some of the characters.

We also learned about how God used certain Old Testament Bible heroes such as Moses, Joshua, Gideon, Samson, David, Daniel, and Jonah to further His will when they obeyed God's instructions. For example, we studied how God enabled Moses to lead His people out of Egypt, how He parted the Red Sea and the Jordan River, how He destroyed Jericho, and how He saved Daniel in the lion's den

As the year concluded, we memorized the prayer Jesus taught His disciples (the Lord's Prayer) and studied its meaning for us.





With their weekly offerings, the Bible Buddies continued to support Scott and Elaine Bogenholm's *La Puerta Hermosa* mission in Guatemala. By the end of the year, the children had contributed over \$370 toward providing water filters and other needs of the families and their children in that area.

June 2024 Health and Wellness Moment "Alzheimer's Disease"

I pray this finds you all doing well and enjoying the beautiful summer months in the Northland! June is Alzheimer's Awareness Month. In honor of those who are living or have lived with this heartbreaking disease, I wanted to share a little information about alzheimer's. This is a sensitive and scary topic to discuss, and I realize that. Sometimes reading about dementia makes people really question whether or not they are going through those symptoms. I don't want that. Instead, my goal would be to increase knowledge and awareness in all of us, so we can be self-aware, and so we can be there for our loved ones who may not see these symptoms in themselves. God is always beside us!

Alzheimer's is a type of dementia that affects memory, thinking, and behavior. Symptoms eventually become severe enough to interfere with daily tasks. Alzheimer's disease accounts for 60-80% of dementia cases. Alzheimer's is not a normal part of aging, although the greatest known risk factor is increasing age, and the majority of people with it are 65 and older. Alzheimer's is considered to be younger-onset alzheimer's if it affects a person under age 65. Younger-onset can also be referred to as early-onset. People with younger-onset alzheimer's can be in the early, middle, or late stage of the disease.

Alzheimer's is a progressive disease, where dementia symptoms gradually worsen over a number of rears. In its early stages, memory loss is mild, but with late-stage alzheimer's, individuals lose the ability to carry on a conversation and respond to their environment. On average, a person with alzheimer's lives 4-8 years after diagnosis, but can live as long as 20 years, depending on other factors.

The most common early symptom of alzheimer's is difficulty remembering newly learned information. Just like the rest of our bodies, our brains change as we age. Most of us eventually notice some slowed thinking and occasional problems with remembering certain things. However, serious memory loss, confusion, and other major changes in the way our minds work may be a sign that brain cells are failing. Alzheimer's changes typically begin in the part of the brain that affects learning. As it advances through the brain it leads to increasingly severe symptoms, including disorientation, mood, and behavior changes, leepening confusion about events, time, and place, unfounded suspicions about family, friends, and caregivers, more serious memory loss and behavior changes, and difficulty speaking, swallowing, and walking.

People with memory loss or other possible signs of alzheimer's may find it hard to recognize they have a problem. Signs of dementia may be more obvious to family members or friends. Anyone experiencing denentia-like symptoms should see their doctor as soon as possible. Earlier diagnosis and intervention nethods are always improving, and treatment options and sources of support can improve quality of life, both for the patient and family members as well. It is important to note, however, that just because you nay have some occasional trouble with your memory, that does NOT necessarily mean you have alzheiner's. It is so important to be in regular communication with your medical provider regarding any health thanges you are going through – both physically and cognitively! Alzheimer's has no cure, but there are reatments out there that have been shown to slow down the progression of symptoms.
