Dog's Pause

Our bishop, Bishop Lanette, has written a powerful, thought-provoking letter. It is a call to put our faith to work. Here's a paragraph from her letter.

"I write to you with a heavy heart and a determined spirit as we navigate a time when the sacred spaces of our lives — schools, hospitals, and faith communities — are under threat of violation. No matter our political leanings, recent actions that permit raids by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) in these spaces where children are learning, the infirm are receiving care, and congregations are engaged in worship and ministry strike at the heart of who we are as people of faith and as a church committed to the Gospel of Jesus Christ." I so appreciate our bishop's point that there are issues that we, as followers of Jesus, must respond to regardless of our political leanings. We can differ on how matters of immigration are dealt with, but we all understand that Jesus tells us love, compassion, and mercy need to be practiced in all our interaction. We live in a time where there is no room to turn a blind eye toward the situation or to put our head in the sand.

That, however, is not the main point of my article. Jesus tells the story in Luke 18 of the widow who keeps pestering the judge for justice. The Lord ends the parable with this question, "However, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?" Faith is made evident by the way we live.

Not all the Bible is meant to be read literally, it contains a variety of types of literature. I believe in the prophetic word, not only in the form of speaking truth to situations as we read in the bishop's letter, but also speaking of what is to come. Both are scriptural. When the Bible speaks of the return of Christ, the full establishment of God's Kingdom, a time of judgement, I accept it just as I read it.

What we witness unfolding in our nation and globally today confirms in my heart how quickly one individual can be yielded total power and control at alarming speed. Do I have any idea who that person will be or when such time will come? No. However, Jesus does say to those who believe there are no indicators..." Now learn this lesson from the fig tree: As soon as its twigs get tender and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. Even so, when you see all these things, you know that it is near, right at the door...."

How do we respond? Jesus tells us to keep watch. Be aware. Readiness begins first by receiving the forgiveness and grace Jesus extends to all who believe. Watching means to be living our faith. The example Jesus uses for this is right where Bishop Lanette's letter brings us, living obediently, practicing faithfulness, being merciful, and seeking justice. (Read Matthew 24 and 25 paying special attention to verses 31-46 of chapter 25)

What an important time to embrace and live fully into who we are as followers of Jesus. How great it is to be a part of a connection that emphasizes our personal life in Christ and matters of justice in our society! We can truly be the hands and feet of Jesus in ways that make a huge difference in our community and beyond. Let us live for God boldly and bravely!
